

Alexander Sladkovsky, a Russian conductor, a benefactor, the People's Artist of Russia, assisted Maris Jansons and Mstislav Rostropovich, from 2006 to 2010 he was the conductor of the New Russia State Symphony Orchestra under the direction of Yuri Bashmet. Since 2010 Alexander Sladkovsky is an Artistic Director and a Chief Conductor of the Tatarstan National Symphony Orchestra in the city of Kazan (Tatarstan, Russia).

In December 2016, Alexander Sladkovsky and the TNSO made a tour in Europe, participating in the Bratislava Music Festival, performing in the Vienna Musikverein, in the Brucknerhaus Linz, in Staatstheater Karlsruhe and the Musical Theatre Basel. The performance in Musikverein was recorded by the Mezzo channel. In December 2018, the orchestra and Maestro Alexander Sladkovsky made the first tour in China; in 2014 and 2019 they performed at the La folle journée festival in Japan and France.

In 2014 the Mezzo TV Channel recorded a concert of the Tatarstan National Symphony Orchestra under the direction of Alexander Sladkovsky for the first time. Since then concerts of the TNSO are recorded and broadcasted by Mezzo TV and Medici.tv channels every year. Moreover, one of the concerts at the La folle journée festival in 2019 in Nantes was recorded and broadcasted by ARTE channel.

In 2016 in cooperation with the Melodiya record label several global musical projects were realized: the recording of three symphonies of G. Mahler (Nos. 1, 5, 9) and also recordings of all symphonies and concertos of D. Shostakovich. In spring, the Sony Classical label will release 2020 recordings with all of Tchaikovsky's symphonies and concertos.

The Tatarstan National Symphony Orchestra under the direction of Alexander Sladkovsky is currently the first and only regional orchestra that has been honored to have its own annual subscription in the Moscow State Philharmonic Society.

In 2019, Alexander Sladkovsky has been awarded the Sergei Rachmaninov International Award in the nomination "Special Project in the Name of Sergei Rachmaninov" for special attention to his legacy and organizing the Sergei Rachmaninov International Festival "White Lilac" in Kazan. In the autumn of 2019, Alexander Sladkovsky established an annual scholarship at the Moscow Conservatory for students of Opera and Symphony Conducting Division aimed at supporting and developing the talent of young conductors.
